## NEW TYPE TRADE SCHOOL TO OPEN IN CLEVELAND

CLEVELAND, O., July 1.—(UP)—A trade school, the first of its kind operated by a board of education, will be opened here next fall to function in conjunction with labor unions and employers, and with the cooperation of the Cleveland Board of Education.

The new trade school, the result of a conference between school authorities, the local chamber of commerce, employers and union leaders, was announced by Howard L. Briggs, director of vocational training of the board of education.

Courses in the building trades, auto mechanics and machinists' trades have already been outlined in the curriculum. Pupils will spend four hours a week in school for which time they will be paid by their employers at the regular rate of pay, the remainder of the time to be put in "on the job."

Labor unions have agreed to accept diplomas of the school, and will receive graduates into full standing in the respective unions.

## SWEDISH WAITERS WAR ON TIPPING SYSTEM

STOCKHOLM, (UP)—The Swedish Waiters' Union has declared war on the tipping system and in its agitation for fixed wages instead of tips it has discovered an ally in the country's liquor law which declares that the compensation of those serving liquor should under no circumstances be dependent on the amount of alcohol sold.

That being the case, the union has petitioned the Government Minister of Finance to explain how the waiters in the restaurants and hotels with the right to serve liquors with meals can be paid their wages independently of how many drinks they serve, or how the tipping system can be reconciled with the public ordinances. The question has been referred to a committee of experts for solution.

## MONKEYS REANIMATED BY NEW GLASS ROOF

LONDON, (UP)—Monkeys no longer mope in the London Zoo since they have had installed over their quarters a roof made of a special glass which lets in the ultra-violet rays.

According to Dr. Chalmers Mitchell, director of the Zoo, the ultra-violet rays which are excluded by the ordinary window glass, are just what the simians crave and they have responded automatically to the stimulus. They chatter and swing, and hurl their cocoanuts around with twice the abandon they showed before.
