STEWART'S WASHINGTON LETTERED

Washington — Tearing down a ghost's "haunt" and chucking the ghost out into the cold seems like a mean trick.
Nevertheless that's what the government's talking about doing to one of the best known "haunts" in Washington — the old house at 25 First street, northeast, close to the Capitol, where the National Woman's Party has had its headquarters for the last half dozen years.
The government wants the site for a new Supreme Court building.
Major Henry Wirtz's ghost's prior claim doesn't appear to enter into the government's calculations at all.
Major Wirtz was superintendent of Andersonville prison, where Union prisoners were kept, in the south, during the Civil War.
The horrors of Andersonville were a by-word of the period and for long afterward. The captives died there like flies. Wirtz was held up as an arch-fiend. Who knows now? Was he as black as he was painted? Or had he excuses to offer, which, in the state of feeling at the time, weren't recognized?
