ghost out into the cold seems like a mean trick.

Nevertheless that's what the government's talking about doing to one of the best known "ha'nts" in Washington - the old house at 25 First street. Northeast, close to the Capitol, where the National Woman's Party has had its headquarters for the last half dozen

Major Henry Wirz's ghost's prior claim doesn't appear to enter into the government's calculations at all.

Major Wirtz was superintendent of Andersonville prison, where Union prisoners were kept, in the south, during the Civil War.

The horrors of Andersonville were a by-word of the period and died there like flies. Wirz was held up as an arch-flend. Who knows now? Was he as black as. he was painted? Or had he excuses to offer, which, in the state of feeling at the time, weren't recognized?
