"STAR CHAMBER" SESSIONS

As a matter of principle The Tidings is strongly opposed to executive or "star chamber" sessions by the city council or by any other body of public officials.

The city council meeting of last Tuesday night is a case in point. The council went into executive session and barred both private citizens and newspaper representatives.

We are informed that the city charter prohibits the transaction of any official business by the city council unless the meeting is open to the public.

Theoretically, at least, this after-session of the council was just as secret as the executive session because nobody knew of its existence.

To our mind it is much better for all concerned to do away with executive sessions. Members of the city council are employees of the people of Ashland.

He went in through the executive offices. There are always a good many politicians parked there and Lowden knows numerous politicians.

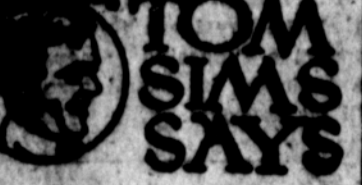

SURVEY OF PETTING PARTIES COMPLETED

NEW YORK, July 27. - The Y. M. C. A., which apparently had its eyes opened in France during the war, has blurted out for the first time with the announcement covering a survey of the "petting" situation.

Briefly, the Y. M. C. A. comes to the conclusion that "petting" is a matter of give and take. The girls give too much, and the boys take too much.

A lot of the boys are good and sore at a lot of the girls, about this thing, it is indicated by the organization's national council, which has compiled its data after a "world-wide" survey of boy attitudes in preparation for the world's conference at Helsingfors in August.

Boys Are Concocted "Boys prefer the girl who does not pet," says the announcement with admirable frankness, "although admitting that they themselves indulge. But they are at times inclined to blame their girl friends for encouraging "petting" and "seeking" being convinced that public opinion favors the girls too much.

No recommendation is made for elimination of such a crying shame so that the public will give discredit where discredit is due, but it is insisted that in general boys standards were found to be high.

"Boys feel that indulgence in petting is detrimental to character," the "Y" explains, "and they propose that such problems affecting both sexes should be worked out by boys and girls together."

Plan Proves Problem This plan of working things out together was tried in a few localities, it is added, but whether the results were edifying or disastrous is not said. Surprising statements brought out of the country's youth when boys were called together in more than one hundred communities to discuss their problems which are given as follows:

"If a fellow wants a 'hot date' he gets it and if he wants a 'clean' date he gets it."

"We wouldn't like to have a wife whom everyone has 'pawed' over."

"Smoking and profanity are both the results of trying to show off."

"Why don't the girls object petting? Why do they seem to like it?"

(Editor's Note: There is no prize offered for the answer to that one.)

"They expect us to take the initiative to stop it," one youngster

complained bitterly, according to the survey. As a 'joint' diagnosis for boys and girls averaging 17 years in Brooklyn it was decided that if the habit were to be checked, "joint control was necessary on both sides."
