## BRITISH WETS PLAN FOR BOOZE ARMADA TO BEAT JOHN LAW

**LONDON (UP)** — Plans are afoot in London for the launching of a great "drink offensive" against the United States, according to officials of the United Kingdom Alliance Britain's greatest temperance organization and the World League Against Alcoholism.

Backed by a combination of American and British interests, an official of the Alliance said today, a plan is being laid for the formation of a mighty armada of rum ships which will "out-armada" any similar aggregation of rum runners that has ever set out from British shores. By overwhelming the United States revenue cutter service with a sudden rush of ships, according to this official, the backers of the scheme expect to make the "offensive" a financial success.

"Some of the rum runners will undoubtedly be caught" the official declared, "but while the prohibition officers are busy taking care of the three or four ships that are caught, the rest will be able to get through, land their cargoes and get back to sea again beyond the restored three mile limit before the scattering of rum-chasers will have been able to make sure of the few prizes they have caught."

"There is also another side to the armada" he continued "that goes deeper than the mere incident of one grand running of the blockade."

"It is felt that if the venture is successful and is staged at the right time from the point of view of political psychology, the 'offensive' may have an important bearing on the next presidential election. There is an undercurrent of conviction that if in the next eighteen months or two years a supply of whiskey can be kept steadily flowing into the United States political ammunition would thereby be furnished the opponents of prohibition and the chance of electing a wet majority to Congress materially increased."

"For despite their allegations that 'business is as usual' the fact of the matter is that British liquor interests have been badly hit by American prohibition. Large quantities of British whiskey it is true still find their way into the United States, but the volume of business is small compared with what it would be if the lid were off. There is therefore an intense desire on the part of British liquor interests to see that Prohibition is defeated."

**SPANISH AIRMEN TO MAKE WORLD FLIGHT**  
**MADRID (UP)** — Spain and Portugal are planning another round the world air flight early in 1937.

Spanish and Portuguese aviators intend to start together from Lisbon and cross the Atlantic by way of Las Palmas, Hespero, Fernando de Noronha and Pernambuco. They then will fly to Buenos Aires, the Falkland Islands, Easter Island, Pitcairn Island, Tahiti, Apia, Noumea, Townsville, Australia, Dili and Surabaya in Java, to reach the Asia continent at Singapore. Continue they will follow the strait of Malacca to Kota Radja in the northern part of Sumatra, thence across the Bay of Bengal to Colombo, de

Goa, Karachi, Bushire, Alexandria, Syracuse and back to the Iberian Peninsula where the flight was initiated.

It is likely that the Spanish aviators will be the now famous Commandant Franco who flew from Palos de Moguer to Buenos Aires, his mechanic Pablo Rada, and Captains Loriga and Gallardo, who completed the Madrid-Manila flight. The Portuguese aviators who are preparing for the world flight are Commandant Sarmento de Beires who flew from Lisbon to Macao, Lieutenant Jose Cabral, commandant in the maritime aviation, and Captain Jorge de Castilho, another Portuguese ace.

It is not known yet what plane the Spanish aviators will use but the Portuguese have decided to try to make the flight on a metallic waterplane which will be equipped with two engines and space to carry four men, wireless instruments, and sufficient gasoline and oil to make hops of over 1,800 miles at a speed of a hundred miles an hour.

The total approximate distance of this flight is over 26,000 miles. The longest of the 25 scheduled jumps is a little less than 1,800 miles; it will have to be made over the Pacific Ocean.
