New York Lawyer Suggests Remedy in Official Drive on Crime

DENVER, July 15. - (LP) -Advocating punishment as the first and most important deterrent to crime, Charles A. Boston, of New York City, addressing the American Bar association's section on criminal law today, recommended the organization of citizens' constabularies "subject to call like a fire -department" in the event of crime outbreaks.

Watching a hive one day, Neuruer noticed a large snake coiled close to the entrance of the hive. As a honey-laden bee lighted at the door of the hive it disappeared between the snapping jaws of the serpent. Another and other bee returned to the hive, to be eaten by the snake.
