For the benefit of stockholders of the Lithian Hotel Co., who were not present at the annual meeting, the following report is given:

Bond Discount and Expense is being amortized over the life of the bonds or at the rate of \$484.01 per year.
The Trust Fund Investment of \$8000 is invested by the trust company in municipal bonds at an average yield of 4 1/4 per cent. The object of this fund is to take care of Bond Interest in case of temporary default of any nature.
R. W. Price Personal Account is for Rentals due under his lease. Expense Inventory is principally unexpired Insurance Premiums. Insurance is carried on Building, Furniture, Fixtures and Equipment to the amount of \$195,000 or 84 1/2 per cent of their value. Capital Stock Paid In includes all or partially paid up stock sales. Of the original \$148,405 worth of stock sold only \$7,768 remains uncollected, most of which is considered uncollectable.
Bonds issued, \$59,000 bearing 6 per cent interest and \$66,000 bearing 6 1/2 per cent. Bonds are issued in denominations of \$100, \$500 and \$1000, maturing from June 1, 1927 to June 1, 1940.
Surplus as shown, represents accrued profits to date.
Two Bond Interest Periods have been passed and the interest has been met, leaving the original Trust Fund intact.
In accordance with the Constitution and By Laws of the Lithian Hotel Co., which allows a salary of \$2.50 per meeting for each director attending, and a vote of the Board of Directors which allowed a commission of 5 per cent on all furnishings purchased through local stores without any other profit accruing to them in any way, claims have arisen amounting to \$4,091.59, not including any personal expense incurred by the directors.
The following waivers were voluntarily given:
From each director for \$215.50 each, total \$2,155.
From dealers: Thos. H. Simpson, J. H. McGee, H. G. Enders, Jr., Golden Rule, Ashland Furniture Co., Swenson & Peebler, E. R. Isaac & Co., Proyost Bros. Total \$906.34. Leaving the only outstanding bill that of J. P. Dodge and Sons, amounting to \$1029.75.
The books of the Company have been audited by E. M. Wilson, Certified Public Accountant as of March 31, 1926, and all amounts verified. A copy of this report is on file at the head office of the Company.

PARIS, (UP)—Some people can get away with anything in Montmartre. It all depends on who you are and what the judge thinks about you. Leonie Joseph, one of the "petites femmes" who play around the night haunts in the rue Fontaine, has just had the experience.
Leonie and her little pal, Madeleine Lafarge, wandered from bar to bar until the dawn of May 6, getting gayer and gayer as the night wore along. Then they started for a well-known place where supper and breakfast are served at the same hour, according to whether the customer is just up or about to retire. In front of the place Leonie espied an automobile. It bore a familiar number.
"Oh, it's the bagnole of my Alphonse," she yelled to Madeleine. "Suppose we drew profit from the occasion to make a turn of the quarter and then to the Bois."
That word "bagnole," by the way, is perfectly good French of the French Academy Dictionary for "box car," but the habitues of the Midnight Sun quarter of Paris use it for anything on wheels that can convey a traveler where he desires to go.
In "cing secs," or five seconds, Leonie was at the wheel and the car was speeding up toward the Place Pigalle. It did not get far. First it crashed into a taxi, hurling the chauffeur from his seat and breaking his leg. Then the "bagnole" mounted the sidewalk and killed a woman going to her daily toil.
Leonie got scared and jumped from the car like an acrobat. As she fled "with all her legs" as witnesses of the incidents afterward told police, the auto whirled on its base a couple of times, overturned half a dozen fruit merchants' pushcarts—the owners were having a "vin blanc" at the moment—and finally came to a stop after having demolished the plate glass window of a jewelry store.
