Salmon Poisoning—Cause of fatal result to dogs and foxes that eat salmon has been traced to a parasite on the fish, believes E. F. Averill, state game warden, and Dr. B. T. Simms, veterinarian at Oregon Agricultural college. This parasite was segregated by Dr. Henry B. Ward on fish at the Oakridge hatchery. Dr. Ward found thousands of these parasites on one salmon. Dr. Simms has become convinced that this parasite has been the cause of the death of dogs and foxes after being fed raw salmon. Dr. Ward termed this parasite a "flake", but Dr. Simms believes he at last has discovered the cause of salmon poisoning. Medford Mail Tribune
