Santa Cruz Will Observe Fiesta

SANTA CRUZ, Canary Islands. (UP)—The annual fiesta, in honor of the great naval victory of Santa Cruz, will be held here tomorrow. It has been celebrated in this way ever since 1767.

English visitors find the fiesta hard to follow (UP)—The Santa Cruz victory was the defeat of Nelson, their great admiral. So they go to the island de la Concepcion where, they are told, two British flags captured from Nelson, are hanging.

Usually the visitors look furthest about, trying to find the flags, but they finally have to appeal to the guard, who will take them into the dark corner chapel of the north side and point to two long, narrow glass cases fixed high on the walls on either side. They must look long and screw their eyes before they can distinguish a gleam of red, and their imaginations supply the white and blue.

Thus they realize it is true, that strange story of why the fiesta is being held. If they check further on their history they learn that in 1762 Nelson, who also lost his arm and 300 men, to the Spaniard's loss of 32.
