SUER IN ROBERT SO FORECLOSURE MORTGAGE ALIAS SUMMONS

IN THE CIRCUIT COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON, FOR JACKSON COUNTY.

THE CITIZENS BANK OF ASHLAND, a Corporation, Plaintiff, vs. ERMA N. JALO and Conrad C. Jalo (also known as Caron C. Jalo and also as C. C. Jalo), wife and husband, and J. W. That a certain mortgage made by you and the defendant Erma N. Jalo dated the 29th day of January, 1924, in said complaint set forth before closed and the premises therein described, to-wit:

Beginning at a point 20.74 chains east and .30 chains south of the southwest corner of Denation Land Claim Number 39 in Township 39 south, range 1 east of the Willamette Meridian, Oregon; thence south 20 minutes east 234 feet for the place of beginning of the tract herein to be described: Thence south 20 minutes east 234 feet to the southwest corner of land heretofore conveyed by H. Williams and wife to Jasper E. Loomis by deed recorded at page 288 volume 15 of Deed Records of Jackson County, Oregon; thence east along south line of said tract 3.59 chains, more or less, to the west line of Harrison street; north along the west line of Harrison street 234 feet, more or less, to the northeast corner of land heretofore conveyed by John B. Sells and wife to Sophronia E.
