Annual shareholders meeting held on July 14, 1926.

This Association, which is now the largest mutual association in the state was organized in 1917 with assets at \$584 and has shown a truly remarkable growth, closing its books for the fiscal year ended June 30th with assets of \$2,333,926.99, and credited to its 6,000 members during the past year dividend amounting to \$136,618.00.

The confidence of the people at large in institutions of this character is due to the strict laws and state supervision governing their operations and to the manner in which the funds of the association are invested—such funds being loaned only on first mortgages on improved real estate and the notes and mortgages being hypothecated with the state in trust for the members. Practically all loans are made on the monthly repayment plan and the ratio of security therefore increases; during the life of the loan. This plan also gives a much larger turnover of the funds and thereby increases the earning power of such association which in turn is reflected in the rate of dividends paid to its members.

GREATEST JAP DAILY URGES BIRTH CONTROL.

TOKYO. (UP)—Birth control for Japan, without calling it such, has now a powerful advocate in the Osaka Mainichi, the most widely circulated daily in the Empire.

The Mainichi is a very recent convert, as a short time ago it was among the many papers denouncing Mrs. Margaret Sanger,

promise reads: "Look from the place where thou art, northward, and southward, and eastward and westward; for all the land which I have sworn to thee will I give it to thy seed forever." It will be noticed that this promise, which applied to the land of Palestine, was without limitation. It was to be an everlasting possession. Palestine, then, belongs to the Jew by divine right, a grant which must be acknowledged by everyone who claims to believe. Should anyone deny that the land of Palestine is rightfully the possession of the Jews, he would at the same time confess that he did not believe the Bible to be the word of God.

The history of the Jews as a people began at the death of Jacob, but they did not gain an independent national existence until God brought them forth out of the land of Egypt. It was then that they were organized as a nation, given laws, and under Moses led to the land of Canaan, which had been promised to their patriarch Abraham more than four hundred years before.

For a long time—363 years, to be exact—the Jews lived in Palestine, but were permitted to go into captivity to Babylon because of the failure to observe the laws which God had given them. After seventy years of desolation, and captivity, the Jews were permitted to return to Palestine and

to rebuild its cities. But 609 years later, in the year A. D. 73, they were scattered among the nations by the Roman armies, and since then have not had the privilege of living in Palestine until recent years. The ban against the Jew was relaxed and they were granted increased privileges in the land of their fathers. But in this they differed nothing from others who dwell in the land, there being no definite indications that anything would be done to prepare the way for ultimate possession. But God had definitely promised that the Jews would be returned to Palestine and would not again be plucked or scattered. This promise, frequently repeated, could not have applied to the return from Babylon; for they were again plucked up out of the land and scattered in the years A. D. 69-73. But the Lord assures us that the time is coming when Israel is to possess Palestine forever, and that they will not again be taken out of the land.—Amos 9:15.

Today we see the Jews rebuilding Palestine. They are returning there in greater numbers year by year. During 1925, 40,000 young men and women returned; and these are actively engaged in restoring the land by planting trees, building roads and erecting modern houses. Cities are going up in the various sections of Palestine where the Jews are settling. More and more it is evident that

prophecy is being fulfilled before our eyes. The greatest nations of earth have already signed their endorsement of making Palestine a homeland for the Jews, and each year brings further evidence that the time is not far off when Israel will take its place among the nations of earth and become a means of blessing and uplift under the direction of the Lord their God.

Not only do the Old Testament scriptures foretell the restoration of the Jews, but the New Testament as well gives emphatic testimony on this subject.

The Apostle James, after explaining why God's favor had temporarily turned to Gentiles pointed out that the time was surely coming when divine favor would return to the Jews. He said: "After this will I return and build again the tabernacle of David, which is fallen down, and I will build again the ruins thereof, and I will set it up; that the remnant of men may seek after the Lord, and all the Gentiles:—Acts 15:17.

The Apostle Paul also referred to this in his epistle to the Romans. He says: "Have they stumbled that they should fall? God forbid: but rather through their fall salvation is come unto the Gentiles, for to provoke them to jealousy. Now if the fall of them be the riches of the world, and the diminishing of them the riches
