Of the total sum of \$10,812,000 spent for foreign cars in 1925 over nine millions were paid for cars of American makes.

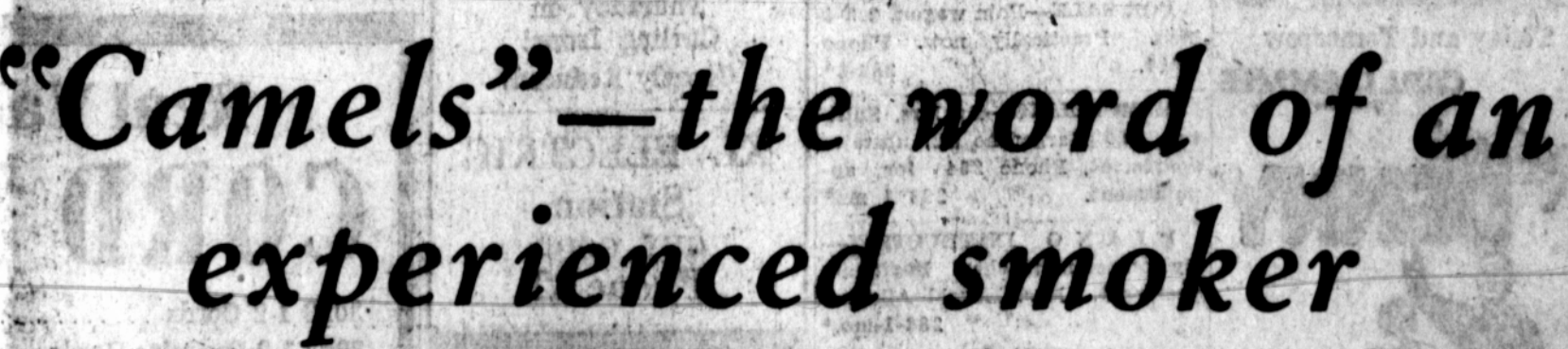
CHINESE EXHIBITION POSTPONED BY RAIN
