D'ANNUNZIO CALLS HIMSELF HUMORIST

ROME—(UP)—The time will come when the world will perceive that I was the first humorist of my age.

The United Press learns that Gabriele D'Annunzio used these words the other day to an intimate friend, when the subject of the strange and fantastic stories concerning the poet which continually appear in the world's press arose for discussion.

The announcement by D'Annunzio of his intention to shut himself up in his villa until All Saints Day, November 1, has quickened public curiosity concerning the work the poet is engaged on.

The United Press learns that the hermit of La Vittoriale is chiefly busy with two new dramas of a very sensational character, as may be judged from the fact that the protagonist of one of them is Christ Himself. The drama treats of the conflict between the Eastern and Western world of those times for the spreading of the faith. The play is in the nature of a Christian "mystery."

The other drama, which keeps the poet hard at work into the small hours of the morning, is also a drama of a religious and deals with the life of St. Francis.

In addition to these two works, D'Annunzio is engaged on his series, "Sparks from an Anvil," and in preparation of a "Message to the Workers."

The poet keeps irregular hours, sitting up in his "camera di meditazione," or meditation room, as he calls it, until almost dawn. Then he takes some light refreshment, and retires. He seeks to flag his drooping energies with tepid baths.

All the approaches to his villa are strictly guarded, and at the gates are posted black-shirted sentinels armed with rifles and daggers.

D'Annunzio is at present on good terms with his wife, Donna Maria di Gallesio, who paid him a visit the other day. The "one-time" chatelaine of the villa, the pianist, Luisa Baccaro no longer lives at Gardone, and her visits to the poet are only made at long intervals.

EVOLUTION WILL BE OUTSTANDING TOPIC

OXFORD, Eng., Aug. 4.—(UP)—More than 5,500 delegates, representing every shade of thought in science, gathered here today for the opening session of the annual meeting of the British Association.

The British Association is undoubtedly the greatest scientific forum and its meetings have long been high-grounds where the blood of conflicting scientific thought is spilled.

At the last meeting of the association held here in 1924, the annual Botany address by Prof. F. O. Bower, F. R. S., "The Economic Development of British Tropical Africa," by Hon. W. Design," "Electricity Supply: Its Recent and Probable Future Development," by Sir John Smell, G. B. S., "Elisabethian Theodolites and Astrolabes," by Dr. R. T. Quinther; "Biology and the Training of the Citizen," by Prof. T. Graham Kerr, F. R. S.; "Psychological Aspects of Social Experiments," by Dr. J. Deaver; "The Production and Analysis of Spectra," by Prof. A. Fowler, F. R. S.; "Acclimatization to High Altitudes," by Dr. J. S. Haldane, F. R. S., and "Recent Progress in Vocational Selection," by Miss W. Spielman.

Informal discussions by various sections of members which will be held during the session include: "The Financial Outlook: The First Year of the Gold Standard; Present-Day Scientific Problems in Fuel; Inheritance of Physical and Mental Characters in Man; Recent Advances in Educational Science; The Conception of a Species; Refrigeration; Tautomerism; Vegetative Propagation; Petrogenesis as a Physico-Chemical Problem; and The Educational Value of the Cinema and Wireless broadcasting."

FORESTS CLOSED IN HAZARDOUS MONTHS

Almost two and a half million acres of national forest land in Oregon and Washington have been closed this summer as an emergency forest fire measure, according to a forest service statement just issued. The statement gives as reasons for these closures—"the extremely dry conditions starting early in the season, the large number of lightning fires, and the need for preventing man-caused forest fires."

Only areas of specially high fire hazard have been closed, which resulted in Watts turning portion of the total national forest area of 23 million acres in the two states. In Oregon, 38,000 acres have been closed to smoking, 2,880 acres to camping, and 149,800 acres to all forms of use except under special permit. The
