VOTE IS UNANIMOUS

Ending a controversy of seven president's coordinating commission last night voted to recommend that Diamond lake shall not be included within Crater Lake National park.

This decision was reached following a public hearing at Medford, during which 28 Jackson county residents testified, and urged that the Diamond Lake playground remain as it is at the present time. Two Ashland men helped to swell the preponderance of testimony against the prodosed amalgamation. They were City Attorney William Briggs and E.
T. Staples. Others from this city attended the hearing.

mission, Diamond lake will con-tinue to remain under the juris-diction of the forest service and will continue as the greatest trout egg-taking station in the United States.
