his full statement was given out in response to numerous inquiries as to why it was not included in the report. The explanation was made that the rush of commencement week delayed the answer to the questionnaire enough to prevent its being read with the others. The statement follows:

"Both Corvallis and the campus of Oregon State Agricultural college have long had the reputation of being among the driest spots in Oregon—a state in which prohibition has the hearty support of an overwhelming majority of the people. The city and the college have been kept dry, however, only by the exercise of persistent vigilance—diligent efforts by local law enforcement officers backed by strong public sentiment and the uncompromising attitude maintained by the college toward liquor.

"The college has undoubtedly become drier with the advance of prohibition. There is no comparison between conditions now and those of the old saloon days. Corvallis was one of the first cities of the state to go dry, local option eliminating the saloon in 1905. Oregon, the first of the const states to vote out the saloon, adopted prohibition in 1916. But liquor was comparatively easy to obtain as long as surrounding towns and neighboring states were wet. By rigid enforcement of campus regulations against liquor however, the student body has practically been freed from drinking long before the eighteenth amendment was passed.

"Drinking on the part of any

student while enrolled in the college or while representing the institution in any capacity is not countenanced either by the administration or the student government. The student interfraternity council enforces stringent regulations against drinking, and the presence of liquor in a house is sufficient grounds for revoking the charter. Students who do not conform to this standard are not welcome at the institution and, as official records show, those few who violate it after enrolling are promptly eliminated when discovered."
