

"Citizens who shirk jury duty and will not aid the authorities in prosecutions are playing into the hands of crooks," he declared. "It is your duty to give your police Bellview Community Club and prosecuting authorities all the help you can to have criminals convicted and after conviction you should use your influence to see that the prisoner is not given a parole or pardon."

Protection Necessary

Mosher urged the jewelers to take more adequate measures to protect their establishments pointing out that crooks of today never take unnecessary chances.

"If a jewelry store, or any other place of business, is protected, the crooks will let it alone." he said. "That is why more than 94 per cent of the 6,000 members of the Jewelers' Security Alliance have not been molested. When you stop to think of it, it is really remarkable that 94 out of every hundred jewelers who belong to this crime fighting organization have not lost a dollar to the criminal horde.
