

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION
To be held on the first day of September, 1926.

TO THE ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF ASHLAND, JACKSON COUNTY, STATE OF OREGON.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE, that at an adjourned regular meeting of the Common Council held on the 19th day of August, 1926, the following Resolution was duly adopted by the Council and approved by the Mayor:

RESOLUTION
Calling a special election of the electors of the City of Ashland, Oregon, to be held on the 1st day of September, 1926.

WHEREAS, the City of Ashland has caused extensive sidewalk, curb and gutter improvements to be made in what is designated as Sidewalk, Curb and Gutter District No. 3, and

WHEREAS, there is a considerable amount of excavation and grading work which should be done immediately to place the streets so improved in proper condition, and

WHEREAS, it is the belief of

the Mayor and Common Council that it is only fair and equitable, that the expense of placing streets in said Sidewalk, Curb and Gutter District No. 3, to proper grade should be borne by the City of Ashland at large, rather than by assessment against the abutting property, and

WHEREAS, there is other street work of a general nature, throughout the city, which is badly needed, and there are no moneys in the street fund with which to pay the same at the present time, and

WHEREAS, the City should pay for additional street equipment, for which payment there are not adequate funds on hand in the street fund at this time, and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that the street fund to the City of Ashland should have the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars to defray the expense of placing the streets to grade in Sidewalk, Curb and Gutter District No. 3, paying for proper street equipment, and in making other street repairs of a general nature.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ASHLAND, OREGON:

Section 1
That a special election of the electors of the said City of Ashland, Oregon, be, and the same is hereby called, said election to be held on the 1st day of September, 1926, at which time there shall be submitted to said electors, the following proposition:

"Shall the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Ashland, Oregon, issue bonds of said city in the amount of Five Thousand

Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars; said bonds to be known and designated as "Street Improvement Bonds"; to be of the denomination of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars each, and numbered from 840 to 849 inclusive; to be a general obligation of said city; to bear date as of September 1, 1926; to mature in ten years from the date thereof; to bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum; interest payable semi-annually, such interest payments to be evidenced by coupons to be attached to said bonds, which coupons shall bear the facsimile signatures of the Mayor and Recorder of said city; to be signed by the Mayor, and countersigned by the Recorder under the corporate seal of said city; to be redeemable, both as to principal and interest at the office of the City Treasurer, Ashland, Oregon, the particular form of said bonds to be determined by the Mayor and Common Council; provided further, that the proceeds from the said bonds be placed to the credit of the street fund of said city, and to be expended at the discretion of the Mayor and Common Council in the grading of streets in what is known as Sidewalk, Curb and Gutter District No. 3, in the making of payment for street equipment, and for general street improvement work; and provided further, that the Mayor and Common Council may, at the time of making the annual tax levy, include in said levy, a sufficient sum to pay interest and principal of said bonds when due.

Section 2
That B. M. Shoudy, and R. P. Campbell and Beth Johnson, are hereby appointed judges of said election for the first ward of said City, and G. W. Trefren, Mrs. Chas. Robertson, and J. M. Beay.

Section 3
That the ballot title of the above proposition to be submitted at such election, as the same will appear on the official ballot, will be as follows:
"Shall the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Ashland issue general obligation bonds of said City in a sum not exceeding Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars; said bonds to mature in ten years from the date thereof; to bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, funds to be realized therefrom to be placed in the street fund of said City for street improvement purposes."

Section 4
That the City Recorder is hereby requested and directed to give due notice at such special election herein called as provided in the Charter of the City of Ashland, Oregon, that is to say, that this resolution be published in the Ashland Tidings, a newspaper of general circulation, printed and published in said City, for at least ten days prior to the date fixed herein for holding said election.

Section 5
That as regards the holding of said election, it shall, in all particulars, be conducted in conformity with Article IV of the Charter of the City of Ashland.

The foregoing resolution was passed under a suspension of the rules at an adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Ashland, held on the 19th day of August, 1926, the vote being as follows:

Relatives Fight Request to Cats

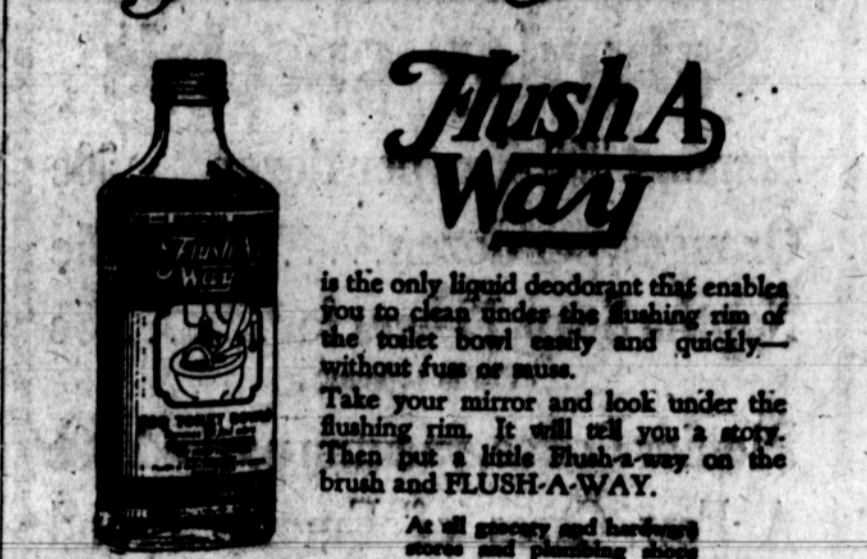
