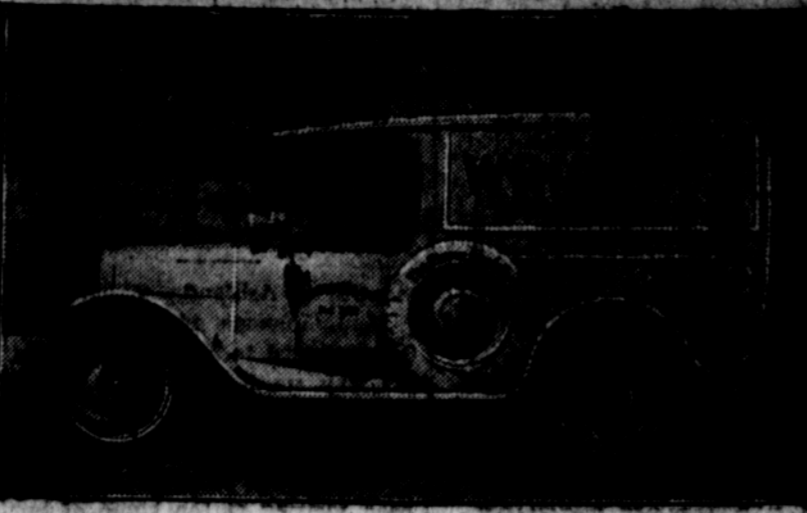

GRAIN DRYING METHOD PERFECTED IN SWEDEN

MALMÖRE, Sweden (UP)—A vacuum process for the drying of Swedish engineer, Edvard Jonsson, of Lidmänge, who before the war spent many years in Russia as manager of the Nobel plant at Astrakhan. After exhaustive tests his method has been awarded a prize of 3,500 kronor by the Swedish government. Usually grain is dried artificially by means of hot air out of a revolving cylinder in which the grain is heated by means of hot water pipes.
