SNAKE DANCE DRAWS MANY

 underground "hiva", the priests squat and sing. Two priests take a handful of writhing, twisting snakes out of the jar and hand them to other priests who sit by a jar of consecrated water. The snakes are dipped in this and tossed on the sand of the sacred altar, to the tune of blood curdling yells.

At sunset comes the snake dance proper, on an open plain. Visitors both Indian and white, line the mesa above.

First the Anloelope priests appear, marching to a little cottonwood structure called the "kisa", in which are jars containing the

snakes. In front of it is a whole covered with planks. It is supposed to be the entrance to the underworld, and the priests sprinkle sacred meal on it to notify the gods of the underworld that the dance is about to begin. Then they form a line and chant a monotonous sort of song.

The snake priests appear next. They too sprinkle meal on the planks. Then they divide into groups of three and each group approaches the kisa in turn. One member takes a rattlesnake from a jar, puts it in his mouth, and prances away. One of his comrades dances beside him and the third follows in the rear.

Presently the man with the snake tosses it away; the third

man sprinkles meal on it and picks it up, after which the two men in front of him return to the kisa for another snake.

When all the snakes have been taken from the jars the chief priest draws a sacred circle in the ground, and all the priests rush up and drop the snakes into it. Then at another signal, they raise the snake up again, dash off to the four points of the compass and release them. After that comes two days of feasting—although each priest is obliged to take a powerful emetic before he may join it.

This is the famous Hopi Snake Dance—and attraction for tourists from all over the world. How the priests avoid being fatally bitten
