Every Ashland citizen who believes in progress, development and fair play should go to the polls tomorrow and vote for the \$5000 street fund bond issue.

Early this summer the council embarked on a program of street and sidewalk improvements in that district popularly known as the normal school improvement district. Some of the property owners of that section were assessed more than they felt they could afford, but still they registered no serious objections and the work by now is almost completed.

But the cross streets must be improved in keeping with the improvements for which the property owners have paid. Heretofore the cost of improving these cross streets has always been borne by the city of Ashland as a whole, and it is only just that the city stand the burden now.

The improvement was so much larger than ordinary, however, that there is not sufficient money in the street fund to complete the city's share of this work. It is now up to the people to authorize this needed money.

If the bond issue should fail, the cost of improving these streets must be paid by the property ewners who have already been heavily assessed. Takewise, it might establish a precedent which would make it increasingly harder to get needed civic improvements in the future. It would be plain injustice to the residents living normal school improvement district.

The commodities designated as 'finished manutures' comprised 44 percent of our exports, totaling over \$485,000,000, the greatest value since the first quarter of 1921, a period in which the inflated post-war prices were still evident. Increased exports of automobiles, machinery, iron and steel, and gasoline accounted for a large part of this gain, while decreased exports of cotton, copper and foodstuffs were largely responsible for declines in other groups."

## BUSINESS ARBITRATES

Arbitration, as a means of adjusting trade controversies and as an instrument of self-regulation, is found to be a rapidly growing institution in American business by the Domestic Distribution Department of the Chamber of Commerce of the United States.

An analysis of 16 typical arbitration systems now functioning, made for the National Trade Relations Committee shows that compulsory arbitration is enforced by the American Spice Trade Association, the Grain Dealers National Association, the National-American Wholesale Lumber Association, the National Council Lighting Fixtures Manufacturers and the National League of Commission Merchants.

The food group, consisting of the American Wholesale Grocers Association, the National Canners Association, the National Dried Fruit Association, the National Food Brokers Association and the National Wholesale Grocers Association, have adopted uniform arbitration rules and maintains joint arbitration boards in the principal cities. of the United States.

The leather group, consisting of the Tanners Council and the shoe manufacturers, wholesalers and retailers associations, also has adopted uniform rules.
