CHAMP'S NEW NOSE HELD PUNCH-PROOF (U.P. Press Correspondent) By Lincoln Quarberg LOS ANGELES, Sept. 4. - Jack Dempsey's nose, which was rebuilt and beautified by a plastic surgeon shortly after his last championship battle, will be no target for Gene Tunney, in the opinion of Dr. William H. Balsinger, who performed the operation. "Dempsey has a punchproof nose - it is 25 per cent tougher than the one he had when he fought Willard and Firpo," the nasal sculptor declared today in an interview. "If Tunney plans to annoy or hurt the champion by hammering away at his nose, he will be wasting his punches." Dr. Balsinger presented a recent statement of Dr. Peoria, noted Viennese surgeon, who advocated a special type of nose, invented by himself, for Dempsey. The Viennese surgeon said that Dempsey's paraffin nose might cause him to lose his next fight, and recommended that it be reinforced by pieces of ivory and silver plates. "Dempsey's new nose is not made of paraffine," said the local plastician, who has revamped the faces of scores of well-known fighters and movie stars.

Velvet seems to be the outstanding fabric for hats. Both dull and bright colors are used. Shapes vary from tams, crushed turbans and small brimmed sports models to wide-brimmed affairs. Often two colors of velvet are combined in sort of patchwork manner to form tam shapes. Many of the velvet tams in the shops must be draped and tacked to suit the wearer. Felt and grass-ribbon combine to form some of the smartest of tam or sports shapes and though felt will

be popular it will undoubtedly be a season of velvet millinery. Linings used in fur coats this season are extremely lovely since many of them are embroidered or appliqued with velvet flowers down the side fronts or around the hem. Many furriers are showing unlined fur coats and permitting one to select one's own lining and floral design. This is far more sensible than showing a ready-lined coat since no two women have the same idea as to linings. One can have one of these exquisite embroidered linings placed in a fur coat for \$25 at several shops. An unusual lining shown by an uptown furrier has a pale green background with embroidered orchids worked on the fronts. Huge velvet roses adorn a black-lined seal coat.
