Steelheads, salmon and small trout are ascending Reamy falls on the lower Rogue by the thousands, following the turning of the water over the new fishway on Saturday night. W. H. Dana, who has been working on Zane Grey's property at Winkle Bar, passed the falls just after the water had been turned in. He states that a solid stream of fish immediately began to use the fishway and that the run gives promise of being extremely heavy. Work has not yet been completed on the fishway, but it is probable that it will be opened tonight. The financing of the work was done chiefly by Medford sportsmen. Fine fishing is reported on the lower river with the Rogue full of the fall steelhead run.—Grants Pass Courier.
