Mrs. Joe Honoh is wife of a truck repair foreman of the Santa Fe system in Southern California. Among the 20 cars that make up the repair train are three devoted to the household and kitchen of the foreman and his wife. Under these three cars Mrs. Honoh has constructed boxes for her chickens.

The fowls' feeding places along the tracks where the repair train is working, this is the place where the chickens are kept.

Mrs. Honoh claims to know when the train is going to move, and accordingly take their places on the rods. They often lay enroute the eggs, but gathering them up is a different matter.



Ancient Landmark To Be Destroyed

SAN DIEGO, Cal., (UP)—The old "General Grant home" here, remaining landmark of the great boom period of 1852, will be demolished to make way for an apartment house.

Built in 1857 at a cost of \$10,000, the home site was known as "Greenback hill" after the financier who built it. Greenback suffered heavy losses when the boom collapsed and the mansion passed over to a Spokane millionaire who in turn sold it to U. S. Grant in 1862 and was named Grant's hill.
