GENEVA, Sept. 9. — (UP) — Cheers welcomed the German delegation to the League of Nations today. Foreign Minister Stresemann, head of the German delegation, bowed his appreciation as the crowd of about a thousand persons watched the arrival of the first German representative accredited to the league.

**From Medford —**  
The Pacific coast air mail system, which starts operation September 15, between Los Angeles and Seattle, may become a national airway. Secretary of Commerce Hoover declared recently in an address before the chamber of commerce and Commercial club at San Francisco. Such a step would mean that the route would be equipped with more aids to navigation, that more airports would be established, and that the Pacific Coast section would be linked more closely with east and west air travel. Secretary Hoover said he would recommend this after the air mail route had established itself.—Medford Mail Tribune.
