

LYMPNE AERODROME, Hythe Kent, Eng., - (UP) - The world's greatest light aeroplane competition for cash prizes totaling \$25,000 will open here tomorrow. It is one of the most exacting light plane competitions in that the winner of the first cash prize of \$15,000 will be required to maintain a sustained performance of daily flying rain or shine - between now and next Friday, every other day over day. a different course from 212 to 373 miles in length for a total distance of approximately 2,000 The same aeroplane and engine must be used throughout the com-

petition, but certain minor repairs will be permitted the contestants without disqualificaton. The first prize will go to the Aged Fisherman light plane that during the six days of the competition carries useful load per unit of fuel consumed.
