DIG PRESS MEETING WILL START TODAY

GENEVA, Sept. 14.—(UP)—With an overwhelming preponderance of Americans and a fair sprinkling from other countries, the Third Press Congress of the World met here today under the leadership of Dean Walter Williams of the Columbia school of Journalism for a five day session.

The American contingent to the congress numbered over two hundred. The delegates, upon their arrival by special train from Cherbourg were received by a local committee embracing the principal correspondents and newspaper men stationed at Geneva as well as officials of the League of Nations and especially from the latter's Information Section.

The sessions of the congress for the first three days will be held at Geneva, while the last two days will be at Lausanne. During the three days at Geneva all of the delegates will be given seats in the press galleries of the League of Nations for the sessions of the Seventh Assembly which is now in progress.

During the course of the congress reports will be received and read from various countries on news communication, freedom of the press, education of journalists, journalistic organization, ethics and standards of practice and promotion of welfare of journalists.

Addresses on questions interesting journalists will also be delivered by a number of leading international editors, correspondents and journalists generally.

Following the final sessions at Lausanne on the eighteenth, the entire congress will leave on an extended tour of Switzerland, Paris, Brussels and London. The American contingent is due to sail for home from London on October 3.

STAMP COLLECTIONS STOLEN BY THIEVES

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 14.—(UP)—The much-discussed crime wave must be near its peak when the ancient pastime of stamp collecting becomes endangered from counterfeiting, according to local stamp collectors.

Hugh Wiley, editor of Stamp Collecting, a British weekly, said in an address here that many of the rare stamps have been counterfeited.

It is extremely difficult to bring these offenders to justice he said, because many collectors are not familiar with the markings of rare stamps.

This Man Claims Egg Championship

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 14.—(UP)—"Red" Morgan, smelter and fried egg cook in one of San Francisco's largest restaurants, claims the title of champion egg buster of the United States.

Morgan has broken an average of 2,000 eggs a day in his 27 years of service here, or a total—estimated—of 18,842,000. He figures a hen cackles 19 times when she lays an egg, so his record also represents approximately 321,112,000 cackles.

Not only a numerical record but a speed record does Morgan claim. He breaks eight eggs simultaneously, decapitates in a them, four in a hand, by a single flip against a skillet.

TOGS ARE REPELLED BY TALL BUILDINGS

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 14.—(UP)—Tall buildings repel fog. Meteorological experts are inclined to doubt the possibility that since the question was raised here recently a group of constructional engineers have taken the affirmative side and apparently have been substantiated during the past two months.

Government meteorological records for July and August revealed decrease in the ever-faithful fog banks which roll in over the city daily, in the past particularly so in these two months. July and August this year were freer of fogs than for years previous, the records showed.

The engineers claim that the tall towers of concrete and steel affect the air currents and that these currents in turn materially change the weather. They say that since the Telephone, Standard Oil, Matson, Pacific Gas and Electric and Mark Hopkins hotel structures shot skyward the fogs have been deflected from their courses.

Second Half of Tooth is Found

BERKELEY, Cal., Sept. 14.—(UP)—Ten years ago Professor Chester Stock brought to the University of California a broken tooth of a primitive bear-like animal which he found in the valley of the John Day river in a mated pair in the vertebrate collection in the museum of Paleontology, University of California.

While motoring early this month through the same valley, Dr. John Merriam of the institute of technology and a group of fellow scientists found two similar teeth, one broken.

Dr. Merriam brought them to Berkeley and expressed the opinion that they belonged to an animal of the Hyeanarctos group. He recalled the tooth fragment found by Dr. Stock and asked to see it.

The two fragments formed one tooth. They joined as closely as if they had been broken apart only a moment before.

SAN JOSE, Cal., Sept. 14.—(UP)—Bicycle road racing, most popular sport of Gracioso and Italy, will be introduced as the next Sunday with an amateur road race from San Jose to San Francisco.

A fully equipped, similar to those traversed in European road races has been mapped by way of La Honda and Halfmoon bay.

Professionals will be barred from the race, the purpose of which is to develop California riders to compete in the coming Olympic Games road race in Amsterdam. The race is being sponsored by the United Sports-iva Italiana of San Francisco and is sanctioned by the Amateur Bicycle League of America.
