PERELI HJ. CAUSE OF BLUE EYES

BRATTLE, Wash., UP)-Your heath determines whether you have blue, grees, gray, hasel, black or brows eyes, Dr. J. D. Levine, editor of health publication, declared in talk here.

If your eyes are blue with silken finish you are in perfect health, Dr. Levine said. Abnormal states of body and nerves are redeclared.

"Every child is born with blue yes, Dr. Levine said. "Even negro children at birth have grayish-blue 'eyes, -never a deep dark brown." Changes from blue to green, gray hatel, brown and other colors are not due to racial, political, religious, climatic, or accidental considerations, but to states caused by toxins, acids. inflammations or congestions in the body.

"Ninety percent of the people have brown eyes, which show the presence of toxins. The color-may be changed by abstinence from certain food.


