ies. The energy of a gramme of Kruppe shelf is about 100 calries; that of Big Bertha the giguntie kun which shofted Paris was 400 calories. The energy of a grammie of our most violent explosive — dilivo-glycerine — is less than 1,500 calories. Consequantly, if the explosive had nothing to carry except its own weight, it has less than ten per-cent of the energy necessary to enable it to escape the earth. To reach a distance of four miles in the air, the projectile would need a thermal energy unit mass equal to 7,500 calories. Where can we got such energy? Nobody
