Children's clothing often costs as much as their mother's. This fact is brought home with emphasis as the Fall school terms open for then it is that girls require not only warm comfortable garments but fashionable ones for the various occasions. For the school room there are numerous combinations of materials from which to make a selection. There are velveteen jumper frocks and frocks combining velveteen jumpers or with pleated flannel skirts. These models can be purchased for around \$18 in most shops. Covert, jersey of flannel may be used instead of velveteen for the jumper of the pleated plaid skirt. Two-piece frocks made entirely of jersey cloth are also desirable this year and this frock may be carried out in a single plain color or with the jumper of contrasting color to the skirt. In the latter case, the bodice usually uses the brighter color with the skirt being of a darker contrasting color. Thus Chanel red jumpers with navy skirts, green jumpers with brown skirts, etc., carry out the two-toned mode. Tweed tailored suits for campus or travel wear are among the Fall favorites for misses. Most of these suits are double-breasted and some use narrow lapel collars and narrow cuffs of fur. Checked or plaid woolen top coats lined in kasha make warm wraps

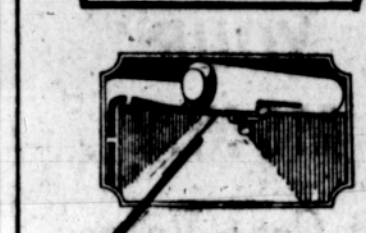
for chilly days. If a warmer wrap is desired, reversible coats with fur on one side and kasha or heavier woolen fabric on the opposite side are lovely.
