Complaints of Citizens Registered and Handled at Alhambra

ALHAMBRA, Cal., Sept. 18. (LP) — A "kicking post" has been established here for citizens who desire to register complaints about the way the city is run.

Under a new city ordinance, a central bureau of public relations has been created with a clerk in charge to receive all complaints about the city government. The scheme was devised by the city commissioners to facilitate and co-ordinate complaints of Alhambra citizens. The clerk, after studying the complaints, turns them over to the heads of the departments assigned. The city expects to work out a better system of government with the "kicking post's" aid.
