

Invents Machine To Prolong Life

SAN QUENTIN, Cal., Sept. 23. Although in prison under a life sentence, Dr. E. A. Northcutt seeks to prolong life by a machine which will decrease blood pressure and prevent hardening of the arteries, with consequent old age.

Prison officials have expressed interest in the apparatus which soon will be tested.

Northcutt likens the body to a boiler, and finds that when its tubes become clogged old age sets in. Injection of an electric current into a boiler, he says, will break up foreign deposits. He believes the same reaction would result in the human system.

Admitting the tests may fail, Dr. Northcutt declares theoretically "he is on the right track"

and that future machines will decrease blood pressure and cheat old age by the pushing of an electrical button.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Common Council of the City of Ashland, Oregon, did, on the 13th day of September, 1926, after due notice of hearing on the report of the Viewers making special benefit assessments in Sewer District No. 27, accruing from the construction of a sewer therein, approve and adopt the said report and did, by City Ordinance No. 833, levy against the several pieces and parcels of property within the aforesaid sewer district the assessments as set forth in said report, to be collected as provided by City Ordinance No. 247, as amended by City Ordinance No. 248.

Said special benefit assessments will be due and payable within ten days from date of this publication, date of said publication being Sept. 18, 1926.

If the owner of any property so assessed for such sewer improvement, in the sum of twenty-five dollars or more, at any time within ten days from the date thereof, so desires, he may have the time of payment extended by signing an application, as provided by law, at the City Recorder's Office.

When the application for the extension of payment shall not have been made and filed with the City Recorder within the ten days specified, the same shall be due and payable in cash within thirty days from and after the expiration of the ten days from date of publication.

In default is made in payment after the expiration of the time allowed, such assessment will be docketed as a lien upon the property and will be subject to six per cent penalty together with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent per annum from the date of delinquency, in the manner provided in Sections 1 and 2 of Article 13 of the Charter of the City of Ashland.
