## Stewart's WASHINGTON LETTER

**WASHINGTON** — Plenty of  
 this year's primaries have had  
 more political significance than  
 the one for the choice of a Demo-  
 cratic candidate for the House  
 of Representatives from the fifth  
 Georgia district, but by reason of  
 the unusual personality of the  
 defeated aspirant for a renomina-  
 tion there, that particular one  
 had quite a peculiar interest.

Representative William David  
 Uphaw is the individual.

Among the national lawmak-  
 ers, for more than seven years  
 now, Representative Uphaw has  
 been the very symbol of prohibi-  
 tion, just as Representative John  
 Phillip Hill of Maryland symbolizes  
 prohibition's antithesis.

There are other members of  
 Congress as wet as Hill and as  
 dry as Uphaw. In the former  
 column for example, are Senators  
 Edwards, Edge and Bruce and  
 Representative La Guardia, Gal-  
 livan and Tinkham; in the latter  
 Senators Sheppard, Willis and  
 Capper and Representatives Blan-  
 ton, Kvale and Cramton.

But none of these or any others  
 have concentrated quite so  
 exclusively on wetness as Hill or  
 on dryness as Uphaw.

Whenever Hill got up to make  
 a speech, the House of Represen-  
 tatives has taken it for granted  
 it would be a wet one. When-  
 ever Uphaw took the floor it has  
 been assumed he was about to  
 proclaim the virtues of prohibi-  
 tion. If either one chanced to get  
 off his pet subject, everybody has  
 been astonished.

Hill looks the part of a wet  
 and Uphaw of a dry.

The former is a big, jovial,  
 fond—from all appearances—of  
 good cheer and high living. The  
 latter is a little wispy of a man,  
 with a very thin, deeply-lined  
 ascetic face and an air of having  
 put everything of this world be-  
 hind him.

### VITUS STRENGTHENS OREGON BACKFIELD

**UNIVERSITY OF OREGON,**  
 Eugene, Sept. 24.—(Special)—  
 Prospects of the Oregon football  
 team took a jump skyward here  
 when two backfield stars, neither  
 of whom was expected to return  
 to school this year, reported for  
 practice.

Otto Louis Vitus, regular half  
 back of last year's squad, and  
 Fred Harrison, relief quarter,  
 were players who surprised ev-  
 erybody concerned with the  
 green clad eleven when they re-  
 ported at the gymnasium. Both  
 seemed to be in good shape. Vitus  
 weighing 186 pounds and Harrison  
 170. They immediately began  
 work on the new signals and  
 exercised lightly to get into pro-  
 per physical condition before tak-  
 ing part in actual practice.

Entrance of the two men will  
 greatly simplify the choosing of a  
 backfield combination and will  
 strengthen considerably the re-  
 serve strength of the team as a  
 whole. Freshmen have been  
 groomed to fill the holes left by

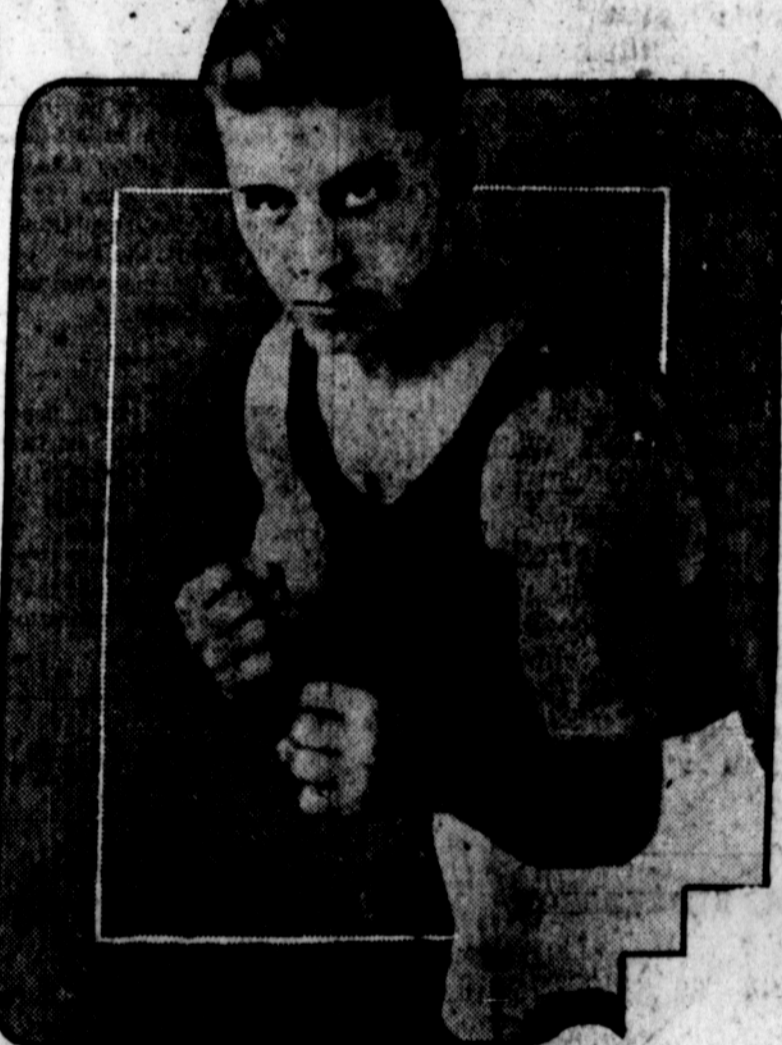
