STAGES JOY RIDE IN HEARSE WHICH HOLDS DEAD BODY

70-Year-Old Chauffeur at Eureka Given Heavy Fine for Escapade

EUREKA, Ill., Sept. 28.—Charged with getting drunk and going joy riding with a hearse which contained the body of Mrs. Ernest Safford, Henry Hininger, 70-year-old hearse driver, was fined \$200 and costs in the county court here.

Hininger had started early in the evening from the Safford home in Washburn to bring the body to undertaker's parlors here. When he failed to appear in due time, the bereaved family and peace officers began a search which lasted most of the night.

According to officers, they found Hininger at 2:30 a. m. with the hearse tipped over in a ditch and the driver sleeping peacefully beside it.

Gutenberg Bible Brings Big Price

VIENNA, Sept. 28.—A price of \$275,000, believed to be a record figure brought by a single book, has been obtained for a 42-lined Gutenberg velemum Bible.

Otto Vollberg, New York collector, bought the bible from the Benedictine convent of St. Paul at Lavant, Carinthia after the Austrian government had given its permission for the sale.

ITALIANS WORRIED OVER WINE CHARGE

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Sept. 23.—(UP)—All of Little Italy is concerned over the case of Anna Pendrelli, pending in Municipal Judge Edmonds' court.

Little Italy believes that the outcome of the case will determine whether it may keep its wine, or suffer its confiscation.

Anna was arrested for having five gallons of wine in her home. Officers said that her wine was stronger than the law allows. But "wine is wine" in Little Italy and if Anna violated the prohibition law and if she is convicted, it will have a far reaching effect.

Many agitated members of the Italian colony crowded into court when Anna was arraigned, and retained an attorney, Wallace Davis, to defend her.

"Anna Pendrelli has committed no offense unless the state can prove the wine is intoxicating," Davis argued. When the case is called Davis will present witnesses to prove, if possible, that Anna's wine is not intoxicating.
