1 Teaspoonful Salt  
3 Teaspoonfuls Snowdrift  
3/4 Cupful Milk

Mix and sift twice the dry ingredients. Work in Snowdrift with tips of fingers; add milk gradually mixing with a knife to a soft dough. Toss on a floured board, pat and roll to one-half inch in thickness. Shape with a small biscuit cutter. Place on a tin and bake (450 degrees F.) twelve or fifteen minutes.

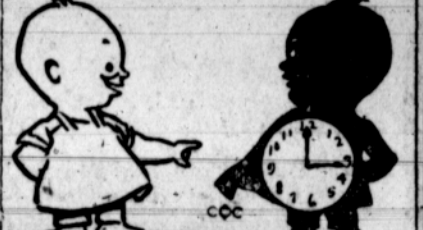
### YOUNG PRINCESS TO MAKE SEA JOURNEY

### Unknown Passes At County Home

SAN BERNARDINO, Cal., Sept. 28.—(UP)—The secret of Mike O'Brien's origin, and until 30 years ago, his past, was carried with him to his grave. For 35 years Mike was a patient at the San Bernardino county hospital. For 20 years of that time he was paralyzed. Mike recently died at age of 80. Nurses and officials of the institution were the only mourners. None knew where Mike came from. He ambled into the hospital 35 years ago, the first patient. For 20 years the veteran patient never left his bed. He talked of the time when he would

be well and "room about a bit." But the time never came, and Mike, an unknown, passed on without revealing his life's secret.
