ENGLAND TO OPPOSE CONFERENCE IN U. S.

Disarmament Conference at Washington Not to be Considered

GENEVA, Sept. 29.—A second Washington disarmament conference will not be considered by Great Britain while the present arms "conference" under League of Nations auspices continues, Viscount Cecil of England told newspapermen Monday.

"Great Britain, like the United States, already is participating in a disarmament conference here," Viscount Cecil said in reply to a question as to whether or not his country was willing to enter a second Washington conference. "I am convinced that progress actually is being made by the league's conference and as long as it continues in session, we cannot consider a second one."

Steamer Carries Big Gold Supply

SEATTLE, Sept. 29.—(UP)—When the steamship Victoria docked here recently she carried \$515,000 in gold, representing part of the season's cleanup in the Nome district of Alaska. The shipment was the largest of the year.

NORMAL SCHOOL NEWS

The Southern Oregon Normal School opened for the fall term Monday, Sept. 27. Enrollment continued all day and was renewed on Tuesday. Thus far there are two hundred fifty four enrolled, but many more are expected. Classes began on Tuesday.

An assembly was held at 10:40 Tuesday morning. Mr. Churchill opened the assembly with a short talk welcoming the students saying that he was very pleased with the enrollment and counting the summer session 425 students had been registered, which he considered very well for a beginning. He goes on to say that the students of the first two sessions of the Southern Oregon Normal will be very proud to have been the first to attend these. He sees a great future for the Normal and painted a verbal picture of what is to be later on—green lawns, shrubbery—driveways and the hill back of the Normal is to be landscaped. Mr. Churchill states that the legislature intends to appropriate sufficient funds next year to build a girls dormitory. Which will afford more convenience for the students.

Miss Marsters of the music department made the announcement that she wished all pupils who were interested in either private instruction, glee club, or orchestra work to report to her.

There will be an assembly every day from 10:40 to 11:10. These assemblies are not compulsory, but there will be assemblies every Friday beginning next week and attendance at all such assemblies are compulsory.

There are as yet no facilities for luncheon at the Normal but later on when things are settled in routine a plan will be arranged.

A meeting of the faculty was held at noon at the Normal Tuesday for the purpose of adjusting schedules and evening the balance in the matter of classes. Mr. Churchill wishes to arrange

schedules so that there will be about 25 pupils in each class.

The jitney running to and from Normal will leave the Ashland hotel every morning and at various hours after in time for each class and leaves the Normal after each class. There is also a bus running between Medford and Ashland. It arrives in time for the first class in the morning.

The assembly was closed with singing. Miss Marsters leading and Miss Frances Strange accompanied. The student body sang "American" and "Stars of a Summer Night."

There will be a meeting of all students from Klamath county at the assembly Thursday.

There will be an assembly Friday for devotional exercises.

BIBLE SCHOOL WILL START OCTOBER 18
