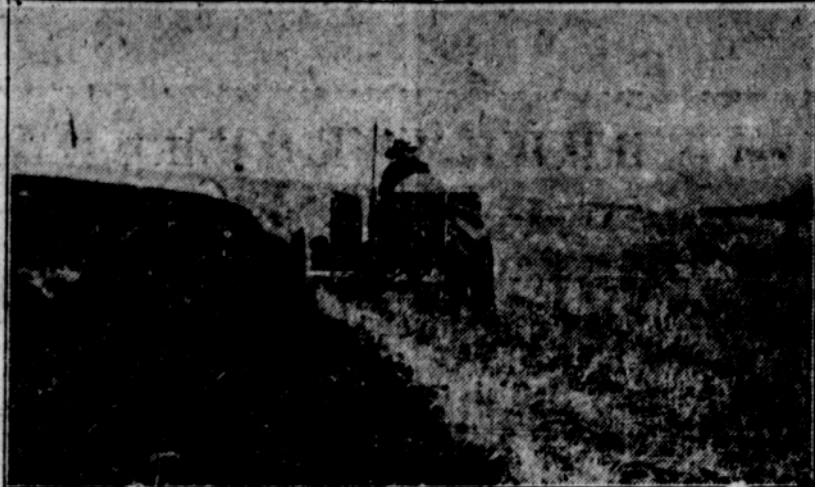

CARSON CITY, Nev., State buildings and all office houses of Carson City were closed during the funeral of the state convicts who died while fighting a brush and forest fire in the outlying sections of this capital city. Governor Scrugham has pardoned J. B. Mitchell and George Brown, the convicted felons, and the pardons were placed in the coffins for burial with the bodies. High officials attended the funerals.
