COLONEL IN FAMOUS BOOZE CASE DROWNS

Marine Corps Officer Accused by General Butler Killed Today

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Oct. 1.—(UP)—Colonel Alexander S. Williams, United States marine corps, who was defendant in the famous General Butler "cocktail case," was drowned here early today when his automobile plunged into San Francisco bay near the Embarcadero.

The body was recovered after a search of several hours. It was identified by papers in his pockets. The body was lodged behind the wheel of the car in 30 feet of water.

Colonel Williams left his home last night to attend a dinner, telling his wife he would be late returning. Mrs. Williams identified his body this morning after it was removed to the morgue.
