Admits Letter

The letter which will be introduced at the trial was mailed from Seattle and received by Mrs. Wiseman in San Francisco.

It read:

"Dear Madame: Received your message. We are going to Canada today but will return to this hotel on Sept. 7, and will sail on Sept 7 on the H. F. Alexander steamship for San Francisco, arriving there Thursday a. m. September 9, and will leave San Francisco that day for home, motoring.

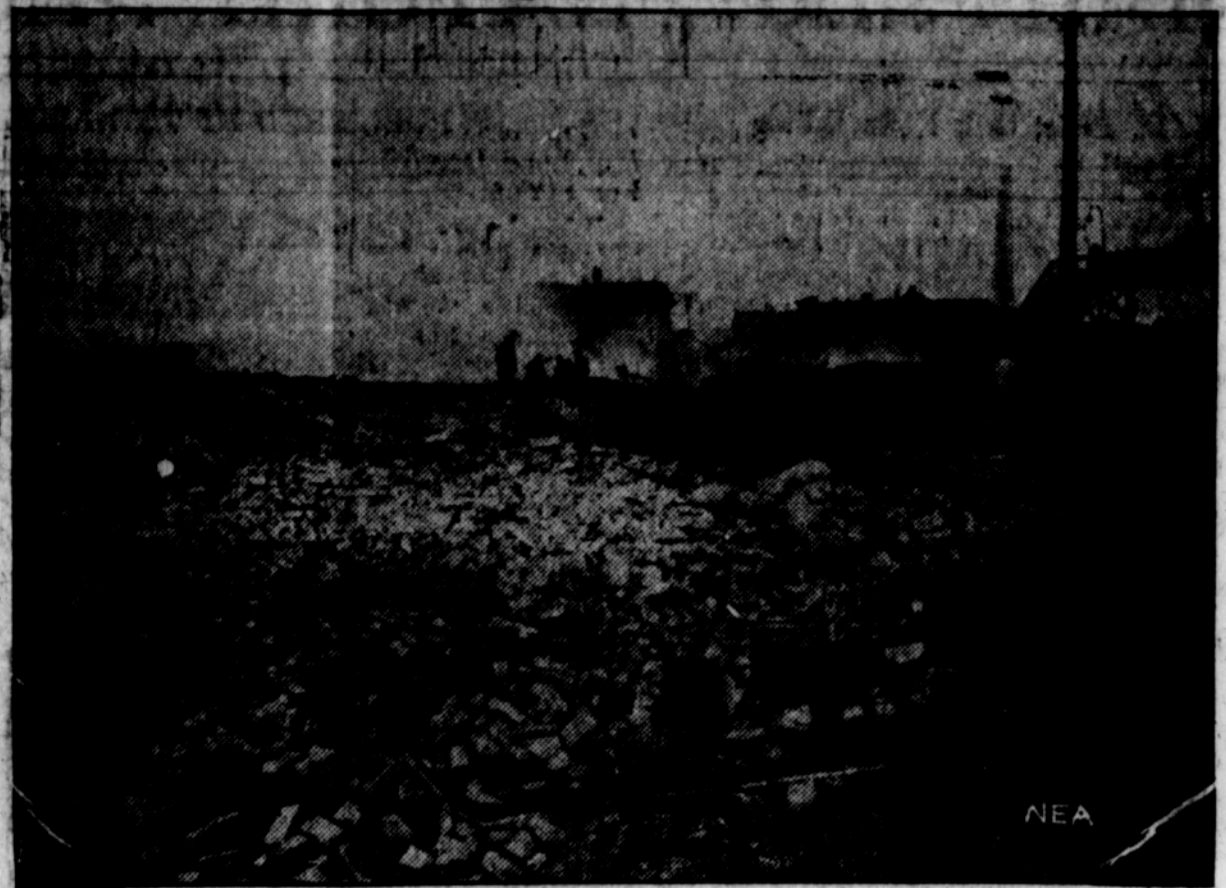
"Hope that by that time the matters you are working on will all have reached a happy issue.

Judge Hardy is expected to testify concerning two other "letters of instructions" signed by him and found on the body of R. A. McKinley, blind Long Beach attorney, employed by Mrs. McPherson to aid in finding her asserted kidnapers.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1.—Republicans here are more hopeful of the chances of Senator William M. Butler in Massachusetts than they were six months ago. At that time many were of the opinion that the chairman of the republican national committee was too much of an icicle to wage a successful campaign against such a warm-hearted Irishman as former Senator David I. Walsh, the democratic nominee.

There was a strong feeling here that Butler would make a poor candidate, and that as he had been the president's campaign manager and closest political associate a severe blow to

midst of the reconstruction period of the war" the Senatorial nominee further declared, "We were then technically at war with the central European powers—no debt settlements had been made with allied nations, and we were continuing to carry the war debt of twenty-seven billion dollars. During the past six years of the republican administration over five billion of our allied debts have been paid, and much of the balance of the debt has been refunded at a lower interest rate."

"This whole program," he emphasized "has been accomplished in spite of a lower tax rate and increased exemptions in so far as the federal government is concerned while probably the most significant feature is the fact that the program is being carried out under a wide distribution of prosperity."

"No place else in the world has even approached America in this reconstruction work. European Nations still suffer from unsettled conditions, many nations of the old world have been destroyed by the spirit of Bolshevism and unrest.

Concluding his statement he declared that "I have satisfied myself that Oregon is in no mood to withdraw her support from this splendid program which so vitally affects the happiness and prosperity of the people.
