Resolution

Declaring the policy of the Mayor and Common Council as regards the making of improvements to the water supply and water system of the City of Ashland, in case the "Water Bond Amendment" is voted upon favorably at the November general election.

WHEREAS, since the year 1920 the problem of securing a more adequate supply of water for the City of Ashland has been continuously before the city administration, and as a result a great deal of painstaking investigation has taken place, and a fund of engineering data and information has been collected, and

WHEREAS, from this store of data and upon the advice of competent engineers, the Mayor and Council have determined that in order to increase the domestic water supply of the City of Ashland, that the only project within the financial reach of the City is the construction of a reservoir in Ashland Creek canyon, and

WHEREAS, engineers are at present checking the data relative to the cost of reservoirs and dams at several sites in said canyon, acting under instructions of the Mayor and Common Council to find a site upon which a reservoir can be built with the greatest economy for the greatest amount of water conserved, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Common Council desire to make an expression of their intent in regard to the expenditure of the funds realized from the sale of said Water Bonds, if voted, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUN-CIL OF THE CITY OF ASHLAND, JACKSON COUN-TY, OREGON.

Section 1. That it be hereby expressed as the desire and intent of the members of the Common Council, in case the people ple of Ashland shall vote the Water Bond Amendment to the charter of the City of Ashland, permitting the issuance of bonds for the construction of a dam or reservoir in Ashland Creek Canyon, that said Common Council will endeavor to cause said dam or reservoir to be constructed at a site where the greatest amount of water can be conserved at the lowest possible cost; that although the Council have been advised by the engineers that it will require the sum of \$450,000.00 for the building of the reservoir and the making of needed improvements to the distribution system of the city, nevertheless, they pledge themselves, that every effort will be made to reduce the cost wherever possible, and pledge themselves to issue only such amount of said bonds as may be necessary.

Section 2.

That it be further expressed as the intent of the Council that every possible site in Ashland Creek Canyon shall have due consideration, as every member of the Council is a tax payer of the City and is just as anxious that the reservoir be economically and properly located as the rest of the citizenry of Ashland.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted, under a suspension of the rules, at a regular meeting of the Common Council held on the 5th day of October, 1926, the vote being as follows:
