Borrowing money by issuing bonds to build a public utility is. just the same as a man borrowing money to build a home on long time repayments when he doesn't have the cash bimself. But no doubt there are some who would not borrow even for that. They ought to go and live in a tent on the desert where they won't need any water works.

There are others who will vote no because they feel that the method of raising the revenue to meet the principl and interest on the bonds is unjust.

It is proposed by some of the present council to raise the water rate to meet these obligations together with some other proposed improvements that should have been included in the bond issue, but if submitted to the voters might jepordize the whole thing.
