**START QUARANTINE ON ALL WHITE PINE**

**Seven Counties Affected by Order of Government Just Made**

**PORTLAND, Oct. 7.—(United News)—**As a guard against the dangerous white pine blister rust which extends to many states through the country, forbidding the movement of white pine timber or trees and gooseberry and currant shrubs.

The order, issued by the government, permanently restrains such movement from Clatsop and Tillamook counties, where the pine blister is known to exist, and the contiguous Columbia, Washington, Yamhill, Polk and Lincoln counties.

The entire state of Washington comes under the quarantine regulations, as do many middle western states and the greater part of New England.
