There is no announcement, indeed, that President Coolidge will do any stumping, though he may have something to say by radio.

Cabinet Men to Speak  
Several members of the cabinet however, will be personally in the field before the end of October. Postmaster General New, Secretary of War Davis, Sec. of Labor Work and Secretary of Commerce Hoover already have promised their services, as well as Assistant secretary of the Navy Robinson.

Secretary of the Treasury Mellon, Secretary of the Navy Willbur, Secretary of Agriculture Jardine, Secretary of State Kellogg and Attorney Gen. Sargent are not mentioned as prospective orators.

Secretary Mellon is well known to shrink from direct political contacts. His speech in behalf of Senator Pepper just before the Pennsylvania primary is said to have been the first he ever made and his obvious sufferings then undoubtedly were such that to preclude any probability that he ever will repeat the experience.
