ASKS AUTOISTS TO USE MORE CAUTION

Joe Keller of Portland Gives Simple Rules to Halt Thefts

To guard against thefts, auto owners should lock their cars. They should have some secret distinguishing mark on their cars by which they can identify them in case they are stolen. They should buy used cars only from reputable, authorized automobile dealers.

In case garage owners rent garages to private individuals they should report such cars to the chief of police. These, briefly, are four of the principal weapons which auto owners should always use to cut down auto thefts on the Pacific coast, according to Joe Keller, head of the Portland theft bureau of the Pacific Coast Auto Underwriters' Conference.

Mr. Keller was in Ashland last evening conferring with Chief of Police McNabb, and had high praise for the local police because of their record in apprehending auto thieves who are continually attempting to escape over the state line with stolen cars.

"It is a proven fact that auto owners themselves are responsible for nine out of ten auto thefts, and this, of course, is due to carelessness," said Mr. Keller. "If they will exercise more care the number of thefts will be materially decreased."
