The "hoax woman" said she told Mrs. McPherson and her mother, Mrs. Minnie Kennedy, that neither Benedict, owner of the cottage, nor District Attorney Keyes appeared to believe her story and that they advised her to take it before the grand jury.

Late Wednesday she began her recital of how the evangelist paid her several hundred dollars with a promise of \$5,000 if her efforts to produce a "Miss X" were successful.
