amination and this ordeal had been dreaded by the state because of numerous contradictions in her early history of the case and it was feared that much of her testimony would be nullified by adroit crossfire.
Defense Loses
Gilbert, however, never fully recovered from his face slapping about and the defense was defeated in two of its most important moves of the case.

Objections to cross examination questions designed to disqualify Mrs. Wiseman as a witness on the ground that she had once been an inmate of an asylum, were upheld by the judge.
The second setback came when Mrs. Wiseman testified that the "Miss X" who signed an affidavit regarding the Carmel episode was not her sister. The defense had contended that this was the case, but Mrs. Wiseman never qualified under the cross-examination.
Lawyers Rebuked
Judge Blake severely reprimanded the attorneys for their pugilistic exhibition and ordered that in future all remarks be addressed directly to the court.
District Attorney Asa Keyes did not appear in court Thursday, being confined to his home during the morning as the result of an attack of ptomaine poisoning Wednesday night.

1 Teaspoonful Salt
2 Egg Whites
2 Egg Yolks
2 Cupfuls Milk
1/4 Cupful Melted Snowdrift
Sift dry ingredients together. Beat egg yolks until thick, add milk and stir into dry ingredients gradually, making a smooth batter. Add melted Snowdrift and beat thoroughly. Beat egg whites until stiff and fold into mixture. Bake on hot waffle iron until medium brown in color.
