BALLOON TIRES UNFIT FOR USE IN DESERT

PEKING. (United Press)—Standard cord tires, instead of the special balloon tires tried out last year, will convey the motor transport section of the Central Asiatic Expedition over desert sands and mountain rocks this summer.

"The balloon tires sounded better than they worked," explained Roy Chapman Andrews, leader of the expedition, to the United Press. "Theoretically they ought to have been great stuff for the difficult country through which we travel."

"But balloon tires turned out to be 'gas hogs'. They increased the friction of the tire surface so greatly that it trimmed several miles to the gallon off our mileage—a very important factor when all gasoline had to be carried hundreds of miles into the desert on camels."
