ter System; providing that such proposed charter amendment be submitted to the electors of said city for their approval or rejection, at the general election to be held on the 2nd day of November, 1937; and further providing a ballot title for said measure.

Be IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ASHLAND, JACKSON COUNTY, OREGON:

Section 1.
That an amendment to the charter of the city of Ashland, Jackson County, Oregon, be and the same is hereby proposed or referred for submission to the legal voters of said city, at the regular general election to be held on the 2nd day of November, 1936, which charter amendment to be so referred is as follows:

RESOLUTION
Proposing an amendment to the charter of the City of Ashland, Jackson County, Oregon, to be known as Article XXV of said charter, authorizing the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Ashland, Jackson County, Oregon, to issue bonds in a sum not to exceed \$15,000.00, as hereinafter described, for the purpose of providing funds with which to reconstruct the pipeline and distribution system of the Lithia Springs Auxiliary Water

That the Council may, each year, at the time of making the annual tax levy for city purposes, include in such levy a sum sufficient to pay interest due on the outstanding bonds of this issue, and to provide for the payment of the principal amount of said bonds at their respective maturities.

Section 2.
That the ballot title under which the said proposed charter amendment shall be submitted, and as the same shall appear on the ballot at the said general election to be held on November 2, 1936, shall be as follows: CHARTER AMENDMENT — Referred to the People by the Mayor and Common Council
Submitted by the Mayor and Common Council — LITHIA PIPELINE RECONSTRUCTION AMENDMENT.
PURPOSE: To amend the charter of the City of Ashland, Jackson County, Oregon, by adding thereto Article XXV in order to permit the issuance of general obligation bonds by said city in an amount not to exceed \$15,000.00; to bear interest at not to exceed six per cent per annum; to be serial in character; and to be retired in not to exceed ten years; the funds to be derived from the sale thereof to be used for the purpose of reconstructing the pipeline and distribution works of the Lithia Springs Auxiliary Water System.

ARTICLE XXV
Section 1.
That the City Recorder is hereby required and directed to cause the said ballot title to be printed on the official ballot for said general election, to be held on the 2nd day of November, 1936, in the same manner as the names of candidates for city offices are certified and placed on said official ballot.

Section 4.
That inasmuch as it is necessary that this resolution be filed immediately in order that the charter amendment hereby referred to the people shall appear on the said official ballot, it is deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the city that an emergency be, and the same is hereby declared to exist, and this resolution shall be in full force and effect, from and after its adoption by the Council, and approval by the Mayor.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted, under a suspension of the rules, at an adjourned meeting of the Common Council held on the 28th day of September, 1936, the vote being as follows:
