## LETTERS FROM THE PEOPLE

The agitation among a few people for removal of the County Seat from its present location to Medford, would lead a stranger to think it MUST be done or some of them will have to go out of business; that they can not much longer bear the travel expense of going over a fine paved highway from their happy homes to the county seat. (Most of them use high powered autos.) Something must be done about this rather desperate condition and the only way these oppressed ones can see is to move the mountain to Mohamet. Their attention is called to the city of Portland, where about 25 times as many are engaged in the legal profession, and the majority of these legal lights are apparently happy and contented, although they live actually 2 to 3 times as far from the court house as our Medford friends live from our court house in spite of this these Portland gentlemen are not yelling their heads off to have the Multnomah court house moved out 4 or 5 miles to save them the expense of using their autos to get to court. The same condition exist more or less in Marion and Lane counties, but they are not "hollerin'" to have their gasoline expense cut in two by the simple process of taxing the whole county a couple million dollars to build them a fine new court house in the front yard. This request for relief by these very few persons would be ridiculous enough if the taxpayers of this county were not already overloaded with burdens of many and various kinds, but as the financial conditions of the real taxpayers are now and will be for many years to come, is simply preposterous and should be so heavily set down on that it will not be made again for a generation.
