

### FREE TEXT BOOKS ARE RECOMMENDED

Free text books in the public schools, the Eastern Oregon normal school, and a full four-year course in all state normal schools are among the things favored by the Jackson County Teachers' institute at the meeting held here the first of this week.

The recommendations of the teachers are contained in the following resolutions which were adopted:

We, the teachers of Jackson County, assembled at a County Institute in Ashland, Oregon, on this 19th day of October, 1926, in order that we may express certain convictions from the body politic, do hereby voice the following resolutions:

**RESOLVED:** That we extend a vote of thanks and appreciation to the City of Ashland, and especially to the school people, and to Superintendent Geo. A. Briscoe, in particular, for the warm words of welcome, for the kindness and hospitality shown to us during our two-day sojourn here; To President J. A. Churchill for his kindness and thoughtfulness in issuing us the invitation to hold the one session in the auditorium of the Southern Oregon Normal School building; To Mrs. Susanne Homes Carter for her untiring efforts to secure the best institute possible for all of the teachers, and also for her efficient and progressive administration of the office of County School Superintendent the past year; To our speakers and instructors who have given freely of their knowledge and of themselves in the main address and in the group meetings. And last, but far from the least, to our officers of the Jackson County Teachers' Association who have successfully and victoriously assisted in carrying the banner for the past year.

Whereas, Oregon needs more normal trained teachers, and present facilities for supplying them are inadequate, be it hereby resolved that we go on record as favoring the establishing of an Eastern Oregon Normal School.

Whereas, this is the year for the office of Vice-President of the O. S. T. A. to be filled by a candidate from Eastern Oregon, be it resolved that we endorse the candidacy of H. E. Inlow, of Pendleton.

Whereas, the founders of this nation fortified their experiment in democratic government by launching the ideal of a democracy of education, and Whereas, universal compulsory education has become an established custom, Whereas, of the three component and interdependent factors of the education system of the United States — school plant, teacher and textbook — the first two are furnished by the State, the third alone by private purchase, and Whereas, many states have tried out the principle of state owned textbooks, and Whereas, we believe free textbooks to be a forward step in the Democracy of Education, we hereby RESOLVE that we go on record as favoring textbooks being supplied by the State to students, without cost to them. Whereas, Dean E. D. Ressler, past Secretary Treasurer of O. S. T. A. has been a genuine friend

and advisor to the teachers of Oregon be it RESOLVED that the President of the Jackson County Division O. S. T. A. be instructed to send a telegram of sympathy to Mrs. Ressler and that we, as teachers and friends of Dean Ressler, stand at the request of Pres. Jewett in respectful silence for a period of one minute.

That we favor the development of a full four year course for our Oregon Normal Schools, that our graduates may in time, rank with those from other states.

That a revision of the state course of study, especially in the elementary or tool subjects be made so that definite objections and standards of attainment shall be set up, and further, that objective tests shall be constructed and used for the measurement of pupil achievement in the light of such standards.

**BE IT RESOLVED** that we are recommending that the O. S. T. A. instruct its legislative committee to prepare a bill and press it upon the next legislature, reorganizing the State Board of Education on the basis of seven members, appointed by the Governor for periods of seven years, one member to be appointed each year. This board is to have the responsibility for outlining the general educational policy of the state; the employment of a commissioner for an indefinite period at a salary to be fixed by the Board; (to make a continuous study of the needs of the state); to prepare rules and regulations with a view to removing from the State Legislature the temptation of minute interference with school policies.
