GOSPEL TEAMS WILL BE FORMED SHORTLY

Religious Work Committee of Y. M. C. A. Holds Meeting

The Religious Work committee of the Y. M. C. A., composed of the following men, V. O. N. Smith, chairman, O. F. Carson, M. C. Linsinger, and H. T. Mitchelmore, held their first meeting with the secretary in the Y. M. C. A. office last evening. Plans were laid for the observance of the Week of Prayer for young people, which is promoted on a world-wide scale by the Young Men's Christian Association. It was observed the week of November 14-20 this year.

The committee also discussed the conducting of a series of men's Sunday afternoon meetings to be held during the winter months, and at such times as outstanding speakers were available. Immediate steps will be taken by the committee to organize two or more men's Gospel teams to be used in conducting services in some of the rural districts and smaller communities where pastors are not available. These teams will work through Rev. D. school worker, and will fill any requests coming from communities for services on Sunday afternoons or evenings, wherever possible to do so.

O. F. Carson, who has been selected to head the work of raising funds for the local Y. M. C. A., announced the appointment of H. C. Galey and John Riggs as his two aides. These two men will each head a division with three teams in each division. They will meet with Mr. Carson and secretary Walter tonight to select their teams for each division.

"Men surely are responding to this work in fine shape, and we are going to have a successful campaign," Mr. Carson stated.

The annual Y. M. C. A. finance campaign will be held November 15 to 19, at which time the citizens of Ashland will be called on to show their faith in the men who are backing this work for the boys and young men of the city. Ashland is the smallest city on the coast to attempt such a work, and it speaks well for the spirit of the people in providing such a work for their boys and young men.

ONE-TWO-THREE-FOUR CAKE
